This fiscal year has been a challenging and an uncertain time for the Friends. However, we end fiscal year in May 2021 with a lot of forward moving ideas and hopefulness. The bookshop was closed from March 14, 2020 through October 4, 2020 and closed again December 21, 2020 through February 14, 2021. Fortunately, Amazon sales were consistent through the year. A big thank you to all the volunteers who worked on projects from home during the closings. Jeff Budge worked tirelessly quarantining books and getting the bookshop ready for safe shopping. Once the bookshop did open, there were limited hours and all donations and shopping were by appointment only.

The Friends currently have 150 members, of which 47 are Ex Libris. This is a significant drop from last year, however, the Friends Board see this as an opportunity and will take action. One of the goals for Membership is to increase those numbers to where they were Pre COVID or better. We would like to thank our members for their patience as we get back to normal business. We appreciate you valuable and continued support.

In the fall of 2020, the Friends collaborated with and became the fiscal sponsor of the Saratoga Book Festival. This relationship is a great way to reach new members and add more fund raising possibilities that serves our mission. We are very excited with this endeavor.

We start the upcoming fiscal year with new board members and an effective executive committee with Klare Ingram leading as president.

Thank you to Jessica Niles and Rose Contadino for their outstanding support and service to the Friends. They will be missed but not far away.

There is a lot of work to do going forward as we recover from an unprecedented experience. We are committed to reestablishing and restructuring all the various committees that have been lacking this year. However, thanks to of all the support in the Friends community, we can be very proud that we have weathered the storm both financially and emotionally.

FINANCE REPORT

Total Book Shop revenue for 2020-2021 was down significantly due COVID-19 requirements to close the Library and Book Shop. Even with the forced closer, the consistent stream of revenue from the Amazon sales has allowed the Friends to continue their support of library programs such as the Children's Summer Reading Program, \$4,513, Saratoga Reads, \$4,825, Staff development day, \$1,209. There is a Net Loss of (\$9,983); \$4,825 for Saratoga Reads, Staff development day, \$1,209 and Summer Reading Program, \$4,513. In addition to community support, the Friends also pays an annual rent of \$3,250 for the Book Shop space to the Library. In January 2021, FOL partnered with Saratoga Book Festival which generated income of \$12,119.

Ellen Beal

Ellen Beal moved to Saratoga Springs in 2013 after working for more than 20 years as international book editor and publishing executive at National Geographic Books, Berlitz Travel and Language Publishing, Running Press, and Stay Well Publishing. She joined Saratoga Arts Fest as a volunteer five years ago and has served as chair of the board of directors for the past three years, overseeing the organization's recent re-branding as Radial Arts. She earned a BA Phi Beta Kappa from Lafayette College in American Civilization and completed graduate coursework in cultural anthropology from Brandeis University and literacy courses from the College of New Jersey before starting a career in publishing. She counts her time as a literacy and ESL volunteer as one of the most profoundly meaningful experiences of her life. Ellen founded Saratoga Book Festival to promote literacy and encourage a love of reading among people of all ages. She and her husband Brad volunteer at a number of nonprofits in Saratoga, including Radial Arts, Whispering Angels, Saratoga Chamber Players, Opera Saratoga, Saratoga Arts, and Biketoga.

Jennifer Coffey

Jennifer Coffey is an Associate General Counsel with the New York State United Teachers (NYSUT), a labor union with nearly 600,000 members in education and health care. In this role, she handles litigation for NYSUT members and local unions; and advises NYSUT on matters pertaining to Education, Labor and Employment Law. She is an advocate for public education and the rights of working people. In her role as Associate General Counsel, she supervises 14 attorneys and 5 law school interns in all aspects of their work. She has been an attorney with NYSUT since 2005, and has worked in both the New York City and Albany offices. Following graduation from law school, Ms. Coffey worked for a law firm representing school districts on Long Island. Ms. Coffey received her B.A. from Le Moyne College, and her Juris Doctor from St. John's University School of Law. Ms. Coffey and her husband, Kevin, have two sons and a daughter. She is an assistant coach for her daughter's softball team and enjoys spending time outside and swimming. She is an avid skier, but now spends her time on the mountain trying to catch up to her children.

Charles Hollinger

Charles graduated from St. John's University with a degree in accounting and business management in 1971. From then until August of 1996, Charles was a contractor with the federal government to conduct various audits of organizations that received government funding. Most of these audits were in the area of foster care agencies and hospitals. In the last 10 years of service, Charles supervised other auditors and trained new accountants who had recently graduated college. In addition, Charles worked on developing his own private practice. This involved providing any necessary accounting services in addition to filing corporate and personal tax, which he continues to date.

Amanda Martini-Hughes is the Digital Marketing Strategist for ISSA, the worldwide cleaning industry association, an education, training, certification, and advocacy association for the commercial cleaning industry.
