I'm always looking for sources of feedback, and not having people my own age to discuss writing with grows frustrating. But the past two summers, I've had a wonderful opportunity. Skidmore College hosts a program called the New York State Young Writers Institute. This program is an offshoot of the New York State Writers Institute, and is open to any student entering a year of high school. Both this past summer and the year before, I've been able to attend, spending about a week and a half living on campus.

Over the course of the program, the forty accepted students take classes taught by experienced authors, creating and editing content. We wrote short stories, poems and non-fiction essays, and completed numerous exercises designed to inspire us or to send us in the right direction. The college invites authors to give readings, so most nights a successful author was present for us to listen to and question. At the end of the program, the students gave our own reading in one of the auditoriums. As a whole, the experience is exactly what a young writer needs to put them on the right path. Taking a class that truly encourages experimentation and creativity is a wonderfully refreshing experience, and I recommend application to any young person with an interest in writing.


